6 DAYS / 5 NIGHTS June 9-14, 2014 Tour includes 10 meals



Day 1: We depart early this morning and travel toward the Delmarva Peninsula. We'll make a stop in Petersburg, VA, to visit Old Blanford Church. This historic church has fifteen beautiful stained glass windows signed by Louis Tiffany. The cemetery here contains graves of 30,000 Confederate soldiers. Our destination is the Norfolk area, where we have accommodations for tonight. We'll enjoy an included dinner at one of the local favorite restaurants. (D)



Day 2: Our route will take us across the Chesapeake Bay Bridge/Tunnel. We can see the water around us as we submerge from the middle of the bay into two tunnels. With the Chesapeake Bay on one side and the Atlantic Ocean on the other we head for Crisfield, Maryland, where we board a boat to Tangier Island, Virginia. Inhabited since 1886, this island is 14 miles from the mainland and until recently had_few visitors, because of its inaccessibility. Natives of this island still speak with a trace of an Elizabethan accent. We'll spend the afternoon on this unique island. Now it's time to head for Salisbury, Maryland area, where we will spend the next 3 nights. Dinner will be included tonight. (B,D)

Day 3 : This morning we will visit the Ward Museum of Wildfowl Art, in Salisbury, MD. Here we'll see a comprehensive collection of antique decoys, contemporary sculptures and paintings. Our next stop will be at the Country House, largest country store in the east. Next, it's off to Assateague Island where,

perhaps we have heard of the world-famous Chincoteague ponies. There are relatively few wild ponies left in North America, and many of them can be found here! These ponies inhabit this 37-mile, barrier island off the coast of Maryland and Virginia. These small, hardy horses have been the source of great intrigue and speculation throughout their history on the island, from how they arrived there to the love affair created in the children's book, "Misty of Chincoteague" and the annual "Pony Penning" event. Here



on the island we will find friendly natives, old-fashioned southern hospitality and a quieter way of life. As we approach the island we find ourselves in the heart of Main Street, with its charming shops, art deco theatre and inviting restaurants. Later this afternoon we arrive in Ocean City, Maryland, where we will visit the Ocean City Life Saving Station Museum. We'll also take time to explore Ocean City's three-mile boardwalk lined with shops and restaurants. Dinner will be included in Ocean City, before returning to our hotel in Salisbury. (B,D)



Day 4: Following breakfast this morning we will take the short drive to the historic village of Cambridge, where we will meet our step-on guide for a tour of the area. We'll learn the traditions of the wooden shipbuilding industry at Ruark Boat Works, where craftsmen restore and preserve wooden boats. Next, we're off to St. Michaels, another charming village where we will visit the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum. *Continued on next page*

With 10 buildings on an 18 acre campus, this museum offers exhibits and programs highlighting the maritime history and culture of the Chesapeake Bay. We'll also take time to browse the specialty and antique shops. Dinner will be included tonight, before overnighting again in Salisbury. (B,D)

Day 5: This morning we take the Cape May-Lewes Ferry and cross to New Jersey, where we visit the quaint Victorian town of Cape May. We discover the Cape May Historical District on a guided trolley tour and visit the Victorian House Museum. We travel through New Jersey and Delaware enroute to northern Virginia, where we will overnight. Another dinner is included this evening. (B,D)



Day 6: Time has passed so swiftly. After a leisurely breakfast this morning, we will board our coach and head toward home. Our experience has been so special that we want to take a bit of the island back home with us. We've enjoyed with beauty of nature, the hospitality and the quiet solitude that's close to home, yet miles away from ordinary. (B)

OUTER BANKS OF NORTH CAROLINA'S SHORE JUNE 18-22, 2014 5 DAYS / 4 NIGHTS Tour includes 8 Meals

Day 1: The **Outer Banks** consist of a string of narrow islands and peninsulas that lie between the ocean and the sounds along 125 miles of North Carolina's coast. The area is rich in history. The first English colony was established on Roanoke Island in 1585. At Kill Devil Hills in 1903, Wilbur and Orville Wright successfully launched the first flight of a power-driven airplane. Come away with us as we discover the lands of the Outer Banks that are constantly shifted by wind and waves. We will travel along the most extensive stretch of undeveloped seashore on the Atlantic Coast. By late afternoon we arrive in the



Nags Head, NC area, where we have accommodations for the next two nights. Dinner tonight will be included at a local favorite seafood restaurant. (D)



Day 2: Following breakfast this morning, the first thing on our agenda is a visit to the Wright Brothers National Memorial in Kill Devil Hills. The visitor center exhibits include reproductions of the 1902 glider and 1903 flyer. Next we will tour the Elizabeth II, a replica of the ship that transported colonist to the new world. The Elizabeth II is located across from Manteo's waterfront. Following lunch on our own, we will stroll through the unique Elizabethan Gardens on Roanoke Island at Fort Raleigh National Historic Site. This is a re-created, 16th-century formal English garden. We will take time to visit the Lind-say Warren Visitor Center that has artifacts and relics from the period of the first colony, as well as a 17-

minute film about the English attempt to settle in the New World. Dinner will be included tonight. Following dinner we take our seats for the Outer Banks Jubilee. Whether 9 months old or 99 years old, we are sure to have a foot stompin' hand clappin' good time! The styles of music played at the Jubilee range from country, oldies, pop, and even some rock, mixed with bluegrass and those beautiful old hymns and good time gospel tunes. We overnight again in the Nags Head area. (B,D)

Day 3: Today we continue our touring as we welcome our local guide onboard and enter the Cape Hatteras National Seashore, which extends 70 miles to Ocracoke Inlet. We will see such attractions as the Chicamacomico Lifesaving Station, Cape Hatteras, and Bodie Lighthouses. We will see one of the largest fleets of sportfishing boats on the mid-Atlantic Coast at the Oregon Inlet Fishing Center. We believe that our guide may have a few "surprises" in store for us as the day unfolds. After some free time in the village of Okracoke, we will board the late afternoon ferry to Cedar Island. We'll travel to Morehead City for our overnight accommodations and dinner will be included. (B,D)

Day 4: Following breakfast we'll depart for the beautiful coastal fishing hamlet of Beaufort. Our local step-on guide will point out historical sights and share stories of local lore. We'll also visit the North Carolina Maritime Museum where we'll see artifacts as well as exhibits featuring North Carolina's rich seafood industry, life saving stations and lighthouses. Following lunch on our own we'll continue our journey as we depart for New Bern. We will visit the Tryon Palace and Gardens. This was the Colonial Capitol of North Carolina and also the home of Royalist governor, William Tryon. The grounds and palace are landscaped in the manner of 18th-century English Gardens. We'll spend the night in New Bern, and dinner will be included near our hotel. (B,D)



Day 5: After breakfast at our hotel this morning, we depart for home. We arrive home early evening having experienced a wonderful getaway to North Carolinas Awesome Outer Banks, and beyond. (B)

MACKINAC ISLAND, MICHIGAN & BEYOND INCLUDES DOOR COUNTY WISCONSIN, CHICAGO & MORE

JUNE 23 - July 1, 2014 9 DAYS/8 NIGHTS Tour includes 16 meals



Day 1: We depart this morning for **Majestic Michigan**, where four Great Lakes lap at its shores. We embark on an adventure of discovering why Michigan spells vacationland for thousands of people each year. Tonight's destination is the **Cincinnati**, **Ohio** area, where we will enjoy an **included dinner** near our hotel. **(D)**

Day 2: Following breakfast we continue north as we travel to **Dayton**, home of the sprawling **United States Air Force Museum**. We'll visit this largest military aviation museum in the world that has more than 150 major historic aircraft and other exhibits spanning the period from the Wright Brothers to the space age. **Lunch will be included** today. Our destination is **Flint**, **Michigan**, where we have accommodations tonight (**B**,**L**)

Day 3: It's just a short drive this morning to the Bavarian Village of Frankenmuth, Michigan. We'll take time to browse in Bronner's Christmas Wonderland this morning. Before we depart Frankenmuth, we will indulge in a sumptuous included lunch at the Bavarian Inn. Next, we go to the very top of the lower peninsula of Michigan, where two of the Great Lakes, Michigan and Huron, surround us. We'll spend the night in the St. Ignace/ Mackinaw City area. (B,L)





Day 4: This day has been set aside to explore the beautiful and magical **Mackinac Island**. Indians called it "Great Turtle" and the island was a stronghold of the Straits of Mackinac for 115 years. We will take a short **ferry ride** to the island, and as we step ashore we seem to be transported "Somewhere in Time". We will have a **carriage tour** of the island and an **included buffet lunch** at the beautiful **Grand Hotel**. We have overnight accommodations on the island, at the **Lake View Hotel**, in the heart of the historic village. It is the oldest continuously operated hotel on Mackinac Island, built in 1858. Since cars are not permitted on the island, we'll enjoy a peaceful, relaxing step back in time, as the re-

mainder of our afternoon and evening are free to explore! The Lake View Hotel captures much of the past with its Victorian-style atmosphere and nineteenth-century architecture. Dinner will be on our own in the downtown area. **(B,L)**

Day 5: Following breakfast at the Lake View, we travel back to the mainland. We board our motorcoach and depart for **Green Bay, Wisconsin**, following the northern shore of Lake Michigan. This afternoon we'll make a stop at the **Sand Point Lighthouse** in Escanaba, Michigan. Construction began in the fall of 1867 and was completed in early spring 1868, at a cost of \$11,000. The light first shone on the night of May 13, 1868. The lighthouse is a story-and-a-half rectangular building with an attached brick tower. The tower is topped with a cast iron lantern room which houses a Fresnel lens, emitting a fixed red light with a radiating power of 11.5



miles. We'll enjoy a self-guided tour of the lighthouse which includes a chance to climb the tower and witness what it would have been like to be a lightkeeper around the turn of the 20th century. We'll continue on to **Green Bay**, where we will enjoy an **included dinner**, before checking into our hotel, where we have accommodations for the next two nights. **(B,D)**

Day 6: A peninsula divides Green Bay from the main body of Lake Michigan and boasts 250- miles of ruggedly beautiful shoreline. **Door County** is often called the "Cape Cod of the Midwest." Following breakfast, we depart and prepare to spend the day in awesome Door County. Upon arrival we meet our **local guide** for a day of touring. We enjoy an **included lunch** along the way. As we explore we will learn the history of the quaint little villages that make up this beautiful area. We return to Green Bay for our overnight. **(B,L)** *Continued on next page*



Day 7: We depart this morning for **Chicago**, "The Windy City", on beautiful Lake Michigan. Enroute we will visit the Harley-Davidson Museum, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It's the best of American design and culture – seasoned with freedom and rebellion, showcased in a landmark building. We'll see more than 450 motorcycles and artifacts, dating back to Serial Number One, the oldest known Harley-Davidson motorcycle. We'll experience extraordinary products, people, history, and Harley-Davidson culture. We'll have lunch on our own during our visit and time for shopping for unique Harley-Davidson Museum-inspired gifts at "The Shop". Now it's time to depart for Chicago – "Our Kind of Town". Upon arrival, we'll take a one-hour Chicago

River Architecture Cruise departing from Navy Pier. Dinner tonight will be included at the **Bubba Gump** Shrimp Company at Navy Pier. Originally built as a shipping and recreation facility in 1916, Navy Pier now showcases more than 50 acres of parks, gardens, shops, restaurants, and entertainment attractions. We'll have time following dinner to explore Navy Pier, one of Chicago's most popular attractions. The Smith Museum of Stained Glass Windows is a permanent display of 150 stained glass windows in an 800-ft. long series of galleries along the lower level terraces of Festival Hall, and it's free. There are also a number of shops with a variety of unique specialty items and Chicago souvenirs. Next, we check into our Chicago area hotel, where we have accommodations for tonight. (B,D)





Day 8: Following breakfast this morning we will visit **Fair Oaks Farms**, in Fair Oaks, Indiana. With mind-blowing and entertaining interactive exhibits, we'll experience agriculture in a whole new way. Absorb the farming lifestyle at a modern working farm.in the comfort of their farm buses. Perhaps we will witness the miracle of life at the birthing facilities. We'll be able to sample award-winning cheeses, and **lunch** will be included before we depart for **Louisville**, **Kentuckv**, where we will spend the night. (B.L)

Day 9: Following breakfast this morning we're homeward bound. We have some wonderful memories to recall as we recollect our time spent in Magnificent Michigan, and beyond! (B)

Day 5: We get an early start and travel into **Wyoming** this morning. We head toward Sheridan in the **Big Horn Mountains**, the scene of many fierce battles between the U.S. Cavalry and the Sioux, Cheyenne and Crowe Indians. Our overnight stay is in Buffalo Bill's frontier town of **Cody**, **Wyoming**. Our included dinner tonight will be at **Buffalo Bill's historic Irma Hotel** in Cody. (B,D)

Day 6: Following breakfast we'll experience one of the highlights of our tour as we drive through the **Shoshone National Forest**, enroute to **Yellowstone National Park**. We arrive late in the morning and welcome our **Park Service Guide** onboard for a tour of this magnificent park. Established in 1872 and covering 3,472 square miles, Yellowstone was the world's first National Park. Along the way on our tour, we'll marvel at the picturesque Grand Canyon of Yellowstone, Yellowstone Lake, the Paintpots, and Old Faithful. **Lunch will be included today at the Old Faithful Inn**. Our accommodations are in **West Yellowstone, Montana**, at the western entrance to the Park. (**B**,**L**)

Day 7 : This morning's journey carries us into the even more spectacular scenery of **Grand Teton National Park**. Few mountain ranges have a greater variety of glaciated canyons than the Tetons. We'll stop at the Coulter Bay Visitor Center, Jenny Lake, and the Chapel of Transfiguration, as we travel through the Park. We continue on to **Jackson, Wyoming**, where we have some free time this afternoon to explore this city, the center of activity for ranchers and vacationers in Jackson Hole country. Tonight

features **dinner and entertainment chuckwagon style, at the Bar-J Ranch.** This traditional western meal is followed by cowboy entertainment, complete with guitars, yodeling and ranch-style humor. Overnight accommodations are in Jackson. **(B,D)**

Day 8: Following breakfast at our hotel we continue our exciting westward journey. We depart for **Salt Lake City**, **Utah**, where we have accommodations tonight. Founded in 1847 by the Mormons under the leadership of Brigham Young, the city first became the capital of the Mormon settlement and then of the state of Utah. This evening we'll have an **included meal** at one of the area's favorite restaurants. **(B,D)**

Day 9: We depart Salt Lake City this morning and ride through the sagebrush landscape of southern Utah. By lunchtime we arrive in Bryce, Utah, where we'll enjoy an **included lunch at Ruby's Inn Restaurant and Steakhouse**. As we enter **Bryce Canyon National Park**, we welcome our **Park Guide** onboard as we



explore this area that includes some of the earth's most colorful rocks. Bryce is not a true canyon, but series of horseshoe-shaped amphitheaters carved in the edge of a plateau by tributaries of the Paria River. An Indian name for the area translates, as "red rocks standing like men in a bowl-shaped canyon".
